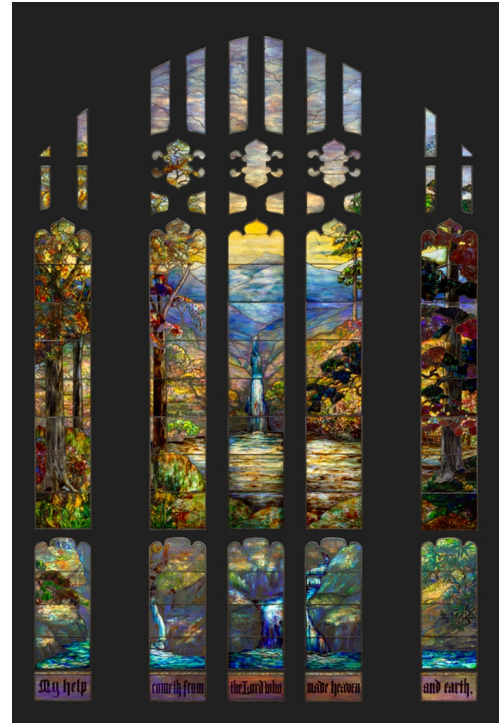

**A NEW SETTING FOR TIFFANY GLASS:
THE HARTWELL MEMORIAL WINDOW
AT THE ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO**
lecture by Dr. Elizabeth McGoey

In 2021, the Art Institute of Chicago installed the *Hartwell Memorial Window*, originally commissioned by Mary Hartwell in honor of her late husband, Frederick W. Hartwell. Agnes F. Northrop designed the window at Tiffany Studios for the Central Baptist Church of Providence, RI. The scene depicted was inspired by the view of Mount Chocorua, one of New England's most beloved peaks at sunset, as seen from the Hartwell family home in the White Mountains of New Hampshire.

The massive window measures 25 feet tall by 18 feet wide and is composed of 48 panels comprising different glass types and combinations. At the time of the commission, Tiffany Studios was the pre-eminent source for leaded glass windows, a firm synonymous with radiant materials and technical brilliance

Dr. Elizabeth McGoey, the Ann S. and Samuel M. McGoey completed a BA in Art History at the University of Wisconsin and received her MA and PhD in the History of Art at Indiana University.
